PAYMENT & CANCELLATION

I'm taking the opportunity to revise the payment and cancellation policies. Payments have fallen behind in the past and I believe this will clear up any misunderstanding.

I prefer monthly payment, as it makes book-keeping simpler, but can accommodate students who prefer to pay weekly. Please review the following policies.

Monthly Payments:

Monthly payment is due the last week prior to the new month. For example, June lesson payment is due the last week in May.

ANYONE FOR BEETHOVEN?





<u>Weekly Payments</u>: Weekly payments will now pay for the following lesson. This means, the first week the student pays for 2 lessons, the first lesson and next week's lesson as well. The second week a single payment is required, to pay for the following lesson.

<u>Cancellation Policy</u>: I remind all students that my cancellation policy is that there are no refunds more missed or cancelled lessons. A make-up lesson will be scheduled if sufficient notice is given. I ammend this policy and add that atleast 24 hours' notice must be given to merit a make-up. If less than 24 hour's notice is given, students will still be charged for the scheduled lesson time.
