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In Rehearsal

- 1. Always arrive a few minutes early to tune.
- 2. Don't play or talk while the conductor/leader is talking.
- **3.** Sit/stand in the same place every rehearsal so you get used to the sound from that perspective. Tap your toes quietly.
- 4. Keep your case and things out of the way.
- 5. Never leave your instrument on the floor, leaning against something, or where it can be damaged.
- 6. Offer constructive and helpful feedback where it is welcome.
- 7. Listen to the suggestions from the leader and other players. Mark any changes in your part brought up by the concertmaster, sectionleader or conductor.

In Concert

Same as Rehearsal Etiquette PLUS:

- 1. Clap for your fellow players after each piece.
- 2. Stand (if seated) or bow (if standing) at the end of the concert.
- 3. If playing in an orchestra, stand to acknowledge the conductor as he/she enters the stage.
